


Venue

As founder of Ngeringa Arts I am delighted to release our 2015 Concert Series.

This season is very dear to my heart as it includes the opening of the Ngeringa Arts Cultural Centre. This is a dream which has been in the making since 2009 and to see it finally coming to fruition is immensely moving.

Our concerts will continue at the Living Arts Centre at the Mt Barker Waldorf School for the first half of the series. With its beautiful intimacy and warm acoustics our artists thoroughly enjoy performing in this space. As we transition between the venues we thought it appropriate to plan a special farewell to the Living Arts Centre. This concert on 9 August, features the internationally acclaimed cellist Li-Wei Qin, with his colleagues Natsuko Yoshimoto (violin) and Kristian Chong (piano). Their program of masterpieces will provide a fitting tribute to the many happy hours we have all spent sharing music together.

I have given much thought to the opening of the Ngeringa Arts Cultural Centre on 30 August and decided there is no better way to mark the occasion than with a new piece of music. I am deeply touched that Matthew Hindson, one of Australia's leading composers has accepted this commission and agreed to compose a new string quartet which will be premiered by the Australian String Quartet. Earlier this year I took Matthew up to the site so he could experience the immense natural beauty of the Mt Barker summit. Within two hours he already knew how the piece must start!

Our original intention was to build an intimate hall for chamber music. This is still our intention, but given the strong support we have received this year, we have extended its capacity from 150 to 200. Even so, I think most concerts will sell out quickly. For your convenience we are offering online subscriptions in addition to single tickets.
